As the Flaget family ages some members like to stay in the old neighborhood, while others want to move to warmer climates so those old bones don't ache so much. Each year I like to publish a map showing where Flaget graduates now reside. On the table in front of the room is a map showing how many Flaget graduates live in each state. It is no coincidence that very few graduates live in the cold northern states and those residing south of the Mason-Dixon Line outnumber their northern counterparts by about nine to one. You say you didn't pay attention during history class, well, the Mason-Dixon Line runs on the border between Pennsylvania and Maryland.

The median age of all living Flaget Graduates falls in the class of 1961, that would be about 74 years of age. Half of the Flaget graduates are older and half are younger.
