## THE KENTUCKY HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME

With the addition of this years inductees the Kentucky High School Athletic Hall of Fame will have 456 members. This is the 30th induction class for the organization. The purpose of the organization is to recognize outstanding former high school coaches, athletes, officials, administrators, and contributors. A number of Flaget graduates are members of this Hall of Fame. Let's take an abbreviated look at those rightfully honored.

Paul Hornung '53, a member of the first induction class. A high school football and basketball standout that went on to win the Heisman trophy and had an outstanding career at Notre Dame and with the Green Bay Packers.

Howard Schnellenberger '52 was inducted in 1991. He was a three-sport standout at Flaget, starred at Kentucky and became most noted for his coaching careers at the University of Miami and U of L.

Sherrill Sipes '53 was another highly regarded multi-sport star at Flaget. He was inducted in 2005.

One person, although not a graduate of Flaget, but with a long history with the school was inducted in 1989. Paulie Miller needs no explanation here of his accomplishments. Also worth mentioning is the Flaget 1964-65 basketball coach Phil Rollins who is a 2005 inductee.

This brings us to the most recent honoree that will be inducted in March of this year, Oscar Brohm '66. He was multi-sport star at Flaget who distinguished himself at U of L and as a coach for Trinity.
